Who Are We Today?

- ▶ **1977:** Began with the Multipurpose Senior Services Program (MSSP) contract
- ▶ Today: Independence at Home (IAH) is:
 - Non-profit
 - A SCAN Health Plan community service
 - We serve the community-at-large
 - Not an insurance plan or medical program
 - Do provide *customized* home and community-based services, addressing both health care and social needs
 - Services are provided at no cost to the community

IAH Goals

- ▶ Delivering education, resources, and/or support, customized to enhance wellness, and foster successful aging at home by older adults and their caregivers.
- ▶ Offering services and resources that support, not supplant local services in order to provide a continuum of care.

Community at Large Services: Eligibility

- ▶ **Adults 55 years and older**
- ▶ **Caregivers of persons 55 years and older**
- ▶ **No income requirements**
- ▶ **All services provided at no cost**
- ▶ **Services available in the Inland Empire, Los Angeles and Orange Counties** *(not all services available in all counties)*
- ▶ **Services delivered via phone, video chat and in-home as appropriate**

IAH Programs at-a-Glance



- ✓ Long-term, in-home care management for adults 65+ who qualify for Medi-Cal.



- ✓ Short-term care management that helps older adults remain in their homes with dignity and independence.



- ✓ Grants provide funding for community-based non-profit organizations to meet basic needs of older adults.



- ✓ Community medication safety program that helps older adults and caregivers take medications safely for better health.



- ✓ Mental health program that provides in-home therapeutic services to older adults/caregivers to help them be healthier and happier.



- ✓ Recruits, trains and manages volunteers who help older adults socialize and become more involved in their communities.



- ✓ Expertly trained navigators assist callers with IAH program information and referrals to community resources.



- ✓ Health education programs, health promotion resources, caregiver education and more.

Community Medication Education Data & Safety (C-MEDS)

- ▶ C-MEDS is designed to help older adults and their caregivers to better manage medications
- ▶ Aims to increase medication safety, improve outcomes and reduce medication-related problems
- ▶ Pharmacist-led team (RN, LVN, Pharmacy Tech)
- ▶ Services in English, Spanish & Tagalog

If the Answer is “Yes,” C-MEDS Can Help

- ▶ *Do you have a plan to handle your medications and health issues during an emergency?*
- ▶ *Do you take five or more medications?*
- ▶ *Do you take 12 or more medication doses each day?*
- ▶ *Are you currently taking medications for three or more medical problems?*
- ▶ *Does more than one physician prescribe medications for you on a regular basis?*
- ▶ *Do you get your prescriptions filled at more than one pharmacy?*
- ▶ *Are there medications that you cannot afford?*
- ▶ *Do you understand your medications and how to take them?*
- ▶ *Do you sometimes forget to take your medications?*

C-MEDS Case Study: Meet Ernie



- ▶ 77-year-old African American male
- ▶ English-speaking
- ▶ Lives alone
- ▶ Has no caregiver
- ▶ Diagnosis: insulin-dependent diabetes, hyperlipidemia, BPH, HTN, tremor, legally blind
- ▶ Referred because recent hospitalization for hyperglycemia with reported blood sugar of 380 and now experiencing hypoglycemia

# Routine Rx medications	8.6 ± 4.4	% Low cognition, literacy and numeracy (<8 on Medi-Cog)	37.6%
# Routine Rx doses/day	15.0 ± 8.4	% Vision impaired	91.7%
Medication adherence rate at enrollment	0%-100% Median: 40%	% Hearing impaired	32.8%
