ADULT DAY SERVICES: COPING WITH COVID-19

Center Operational Status	Infection Control Measures
 No participants are attending center for services Essential staff only are at center for delivering critical infrastructure like accounting, billing, etc. Physical distancing applies 	 Heightened and frequent cleaning/sanitizing of surfaces Sanitize toilet bowl after each use Social distancing (6 feet) Use mask/facial covering Consider staggering staff hours
Some in-center "essential services" provided for participants, like a shower • Essential staff only are at center • Physical distancing applies	 Heightened and frequent cleaning/sanitizing of surfaces Sanitize toilet bowl after each use Social distancing (6 feet) Stagger staff hours PPE for 1-1 care, at minimum require, masks, gloves, goggles, gowns recommended (note: PPE is in short supply)

Center Operational Status	Infection Control Measures
 Home visits with social distancing – not entering the house This means there is no alternative to going to the home 	 Mandate and provide training on physical distance requirements and contact No PPE required, however, use barrier like disposable tissue or paper towel to contact door surfaces, railings etc. Face covering or mask required Use sanitizer and wash hands after each visit
 Home visits with social distancing - entering house This means there is no alternative to going to the home 	 Mandate and provide training on physical distance requirements and contact Prior to the visit - call to check if anyone has symptoms (if symptoms present - do not go; ask about soap and supplies at the home No PPE required, however, use barrier to contact door surfaces, railings etc. Train on infection control re: contact with surfaces in home Use sanitizer and wash hands after each visit

Center Operational Status	Infection Control Measures
 Home visits without social distancing This means there is no alternative to going to the home 	 Mandate and provide training on infection control & PPE; bag technique if entering home PPE required: mask & gloves (gown and google may be required depending on RN procedures) Training on "bag technique" and contact with surfaces in home Wash hands or use sanitizer after each visit
